

Urology Clerkship Grading Criteria

The Urology Clerkship Student Clinical Evaluation is composed of the scoring categories below:

- **Patient Care (6 items)**
 - Obtains a complete and accurate medical history.
 - Performs the appropriate physical examination with patients.
 - Develops a differential diagnosis and provides supportive, clinical rationale.
 - Formulates evidence-based therapeutic approaches to patients with common diagnoses.
 - Demonstrates the ability to interpret screening and diagnostic tests.
 - Explains and performs procedures relevant to clinical care.
- **Knowledge of Practice (1 item)**
 - Applies established and emerging scientific principles of clinical sciences to diagnostic and therapeutic decision making, clinical guidelines, and other aspects of evidence-based health care.
- **Interpersonal and Communication Skills (3 items)**
 - Produces complete and accurate write-ups for common patient presentations.
 - Presents well organized, appropriately focused and accurate oral case presentations.
 - Demonstrates full range of patient-centered communication skills with a variety of patients.
- **System-Based Practice (1 item)**
 - Coordinates patient care within the health care system.
- **Practice-Based Learning (1 item)**
 - Identifies and perform learning activities to address gaps in knowledge, skills and/or attitudes.
- **Interprofessional Collaboration (1 item)**
 - Demonstrates effective partnership with others as a member of the health-care team or other professional group.
- **Professionalism (6 Yes/No items)**
 - Student demonstrated compassion, integrity, and respect for others.
 - Student demonstrated responsiveness to patient needs that superseded self-interest.
 - Student demonstrated respect for patient privacy and autonomy.
 - Student demonstrated accountability to patients, society, and the profession.
 - Student demonstrated sensitivity and responsiveness to a diverse patient population, including but not limited to diversity in gender, age, culture, race, religion, disabilities and sexual orientation.
 - Student demonstrated a commitment to ethical principles pertaining to provision or withholding of care, confidentiality, informed consent, and business practices, including compliance with relevant laws, policies, and regulations.

Each item will have a score from 1 to 4 and a GPA will be averaged based on aggregate of the scores.

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Clinical Grade: The Urology Clerkship Student Clinical Evaluation is composed of the scoring categories below:

Honors	47 points & above / Total 52 points (90% or higher) & all YESs on Professionalism items
High Pass	39 to 46 points (75% - 89.9%) & all YESs on Professionalism items
Pass	26 to 35 points (50% -74.9%) & no more than one NO on Professionalism items
Fail	Less than 26 points (less than 50%) OR two or more Nos on Professionalism items
